





## What to Expect When Being Inspected (Conventional Systems)

ALABAMA PUBLIC HEALTH

## Day of Inspection: What do we need from the Installer?

- ➤ Call the Public Health Environmentalist (PHE) between 8:00-9:00am local time to schedule your inspection
- ➤ Have the Permit #, Name, and/or Address
- ➤ Be flexible, the PHE may have numerous inspections in a single day
  - On occasion, the PHE cannot make it to the site and may ask you to certify your installation (CEP5)
  - -Allow the PHE 45 minutes past the scheduled inspection time before certifying

## Day of Inspection: What installers may need from the Environmentalist?

- ➤ Have specific questions about the installation (site, depth, sizing, setbacks, etc)
- Unforeseen issues/problems occur during the installation
- > Finish the installation early or are running behind
- ➤ Communication is key

#### **Installer Requirements:**

#### **Permit**

- > Installer have it on hand
- > Correct version
- ➤ Correct lot/address

#### Site Plan

- ➤ Most recent version
- ➤ Ensure all required setbacks
- > Structure/plumbing stub-out
- ➤ Correct EDF location

#### Installation Issues: Call your local PHE

- If you hit a restrictive layer before you reach the required trench bottom depth: ASHES (gray soil), Rock, Free Water
- Show up and the lot has been cut, filled, or modified in any way
- > Structure built on top of proposed EDF

## Setbacks Ensured: Onsite Sewage Treatment and Disposal, 420-3-1, Table 6

#### Septic Tank:

- > Tank/s have State Permit
- ➤ Approved manufacturer's number engraved inlet end and specified capacity (concrete tanks)
- ➤ Tanks in series, no more than 2. 1st tank in series, no baffle wall
- ➤ Baffle in place (existing or new)
- > Set level
- > Inlet tee in place and sealed
- Outlet tee/filter in place and sealed; NSF Standard 46 (or as specified) effluent filter installed
- ➤ Risers: Dwellings- no greater than 6" below grade. Establishments- at grade or above

#### **Effluent Distribution Lines**

- > Trench widths not less than 18 and not more than 36 inches
- ➤ 5 feet between trench walls (minimum)
- ➤ Trench bottom level. Grade of pipe not exceeding 1" per 100 feet
- ➤ Minimum fill/cover over aggregate/product of 12"
- > Trench depth per permit
- ➤ Gravel
  - -Perforated pipe 4" in diameter. Perforations on bottom (no slits)
  - -Gravel clean and properly sized. Gravel at least 8" under pipe to top of pipe (min. 12" total)
  - -Barrier cover material over gravel approved, ex: Untreated building paper, craft paper, geo-tech
  - -fabric (No Plastic/Polyethylene)
- > Standard fittings, connectors, end caps used if required
- Equivalent Products <u>sized/installed</u> according to reduction
- > Trench Depth
  - -Based on professional's/PHESS's soils evaluation
  - -Based on restriction and minimum vertical separation (MVS) required
  - -Trench bottom shall be no deeper than permitted depth (*Trench depth may influence product/configuration*)
- ➤ Permitted as <u>Gravel or equivalent</u> unless specified by a Professional Engineer

continued...

#### Washer/Graywater Lines

- > 25% of EDF as gravel
- EDF can be reduced 25% if washer line installed
- No reduction in footage for equivalent products
- > Tank not required but recommended

#### **Pumps and D-Boxes**

- ➤ Pump sized (hp) according to head necessary to overcome grade and distance
- Pump chamber sized according to professionals recommendations
- Distribution box set level, stabilized, outlet pipes rigid, laid level or on equal grade for 5 feet

#### Level Header

- > Header installed level
- > Header on same elevation as effluent distribution line
- ➤ Header at least four (4) inches in diameter
- ➤ Invert of header at least four (4) inches below invert of septic tank outlet
- <u>Maximum</u> length of effluent distribution line 100 feet

#### **Serial Distribution**

- ➤ Invert of uppermost effluent distribution line eight (8) inches below invert of outlet of septic tank
- ➤ Invert of crossovers at least four (4) inches below invert of septic outlet
- > Undisturbed earthen dam in crossovers
- > 100 feet or less of trench
- ➤ One (1) crossover required
- > For more than 100 feet of trench at least two (2) crossovers
- Maximum length of effluent distribution line from a tee, not more than 100 feet

#### **Inspection and Approval**

- > All requirements of the system checked by the PHE
- ➤ CEP5 required at inspection to attain Approval (*Pink Copy*)

#### **Installer Certification**

- > PHE, at times, may ask installer to certify the installation of the system
- CEP5 must submitted to the PHE within 3 business days
- > Approval given once CEP5 has been received







## 2020 Regular Session of the Alabama Legislature Convenes February 4

The 2020 Regular Session of the Alabama Legislature begins on Tuesday, February 4. Major topics expected to be considered this year include prison reform, medical marijuana, gambling/lottery, and issues surrounding the education and general fund budgets. After members convene the session on the 4th at noon, the Governor presents her State of the State Address that evening, where she will have an opportunity to highlight her priorities for the session. With the threat of a federal solution to our prison's problems looming, expect that topic to be a pressing issue this session.

In the upcoming session, the AOWA is supporting legislation to increase the maximum fine amount that can be levied by the Alabama Onsite Wastewater Board. That bill is currently being drafted and will be ready to introduce early in the session. Once that occurs, we will provide the AOWA members with the bill number and relevant information for you to contact your local legislators to ask them to support the measure. Please stay tuned and look for future updates as the process moves along. We will need the support of the AOWA members to pass this legislation. With so many bills introduced each session, it is important that legislators hear from their local constituents to make sure your concerns are addressed.

Also coming up soon are election primaries, which are held in March during presidential election years. The races getting the most attention are mostly federal, especially the Republican race to challenge current U.S. Senator Doug Jones in the fall. It will be interesting to see if any of the candidates can garner enough support to win the primary without a run-off. Another race to watch is in the Alabama Supreme Court, where State Senator Cam Ward is challenging current court member Greg Shaw.

Stay tuned as the session kicks off in February. We will be sure to keep you updated.

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### **News from the AOWB**



#### **Happy New Year Licensees!**

I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a Happy and prosperous New Year! I hope by this time most of you have met our new compliance officers. Mr. Joel Barnes, who serves the southern half of the state and Mr. Caleb Kilpatrick, who serves the northern part of the state. Please feel free to contact our administrative office if you would like to schedule a visit with the officer that serves your area.

I have a few items of interest I would like to share with you.

#### **DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES**

How the disciplinary process works: 90% of our complaints come in from the Local Health Departments. Once a complaint is received, it is logged in our database. I write a letter/ email to the respondent about the complaint and ask them to respond in writing (meanwhile the investigation has begun/ gathering of facts). The AOWB has a probable cause committee. The committee consists of the Board's attorney, a Board member, the Executive Director and the investigator. The committee reviews all material relevant to the complaint and discusses it to see if any violations have occurred. Once the committee finds probable cause, the Executive Director

sends a notice of administrative complaint scheduled with a hearing date. What happens on Hearing Day? The AOWB is represented by their attorney, Mr. Beau Cooper. The respondent may represent him/herself, or they may hire representation at their own expense. The licensee may want to contact the Alabama Onsite Wastewater Association if they are members as they may be able to assist licensees regarding such matters. The Administrative Hearing has an Administrative Hearing Officer that is retained through the Alabama Personnel Department or the Attorney Generals Office. There is also a court reporter present. The Administrative complaint is heard by the hearing officer and the nine-member Alabama Onsite Wastewater Board. Once the hearing concludes, the hearing officer awaits the transcripts from the court reporter. Once he receives the transcripts, he/she goes over the case again and writes a ruling/recommendation. The licensee/attorney/executive director are mailed a copy of the ruling/recommendation. At the next Quarterly Board Meeting, the Board reviews the hearing officer's recommendation and the Board goes in to Executive session to discuss each case. The Board then votes on each case. They will choose to either accept the hearing officer's recommendation, make their

own recommendation on each case, or add to the hearing officer's recommendation.

I encourage you all to visit our website for various information – such as forms, disciplinary actions, upcoming events as well as the roster. If you discover your name isn't on the roster, please contact the office as soon as possible.

As always, if there is anything the AOWB administrative staff could assist you with, please feel free to contact us anytime!



A scholarship recipient may attend the school of their choice, whether ACADEMIC, VOCATIONAL, or TECHNICAL, in or out of the state of Alabama. Scholarships are \$1000 per school year for the recipient.

Persons eligible to apply for the scholarships are AOWA members, spouses of members, children of members, grandchildren, stepchildren, and other immediate family members of a member having no children or having underage children, employees and their children of AOWA member companies who have worked an average of 25 hours per week for at least 6 months for that member company, and member employee's children as well as AOWA employees. Documentation of such employment must be attached to the application. The Scholarship Committee makes the award selections from the application information submitted.

Scholarships are for the 2020 - 2021 academic year. Being approved for one scholarship does not disqualify an applicant from applying for another in a subsequent year. Past scholarship recipients must re-apply and complete the entire application if they wish to be considered for the current year. Failing, without good cause, to complete the courses for which the first scholarship was issued will result in disqualification for a second.

The application must be fully complete. If the question does not apply to you please put N/A in the field. It is important this application be totally complete. In addition to the application, the applicant must submit a cover letter or summary of the applicant's ambitions and goals, the reason they are pursuing their major or career choice and why they are applying for this scholarship. An official school transcript is also required.

The Scholarship Committee may cancel the scholarship at any time for due cause. Examples are: not attending classes, misusing tools, grades falling below a "C", conviction of a crime, fraudulent acts in school, not using the scholarship in the awarded year, discovery that false information was submitted on the application. At the end of the year a class transcript or class registration form must be submitted as final documentation. If the scholarship recipient stops attending school without good cause, or the scholarship is cancelled he/she shall reimburse AOWA for all monies received. Scholarships are non-transferrable.

Applications will be judged by the Scholarship Review committee. The criteria on which the applications are evaluated are:

- Academic Achievement **35%**
- Youth Leadership 30%
- Commitment to Education and Career Goals as stated in the cover letter 30%
- Financial Support 5%
